

Strongbond DIY

Carpet and vinyl adhesive

DESCRIPTION

An acrylic based adhesive with excellent plasticiser resistance.

USES

Strongbond DIY – Carpet and Vinyl Adhesive is recommended for bonding plasticised vinyl floor and wall coverings and PVC backed carpets.

It is suitable for bonding most commercial and domestic vinyl sheeting products. It will bond both homogenous and foamed backed type vinyl to sound, smooth dry subfloors of concrete; conventional sand/cement screeds or underlayment; plywood; hardboard or cement sheet underlays. Other surfaces, such as asphalt, granolithic, terrazzo, quarry tiles and concrete surfaces treated with waterproof membranes, or some curing agents should be skimmed with a minimum of 3mm of a proprietary cementitious underlayment according to manufacturer's recommendations.

Open time	Allow the adhesive to air generally 5-10 minutes at 20° C before lowering the floorcoverings into the wet film of adhesive. Airing times will depend upon temperature, humidity conditions and substrate absorbency
Coverage	4-6m2 per litre. Spread rates may vary depending on substrate absorbency and notched trowel used for the job

SURFACE PREPARATION

To be in accordance with the current New Zealand NZS AS 1884:2013, Australian Standards AS 1884:2021 & Australian Standard "Floor Coverings - 1884-2012 Resilient Sheet & Tiles - Laying & Maintenance Practices" or Australian Standard 2455.2.2019 "Textile Floor Coverings - Installation Practice".

All surfaces to be bonded shall be absorbent, dry, smooth, sound and clean. Subfloors must also be free of wax, grease, paint, previously used adhesive, polish, PVC based membranes, curing compounds, hydrostatic pressure and any other impurities that may affect adhesion.

The minimum subfloor temperature before commencing surface preparation and adhesive application is 10°C . STRONGBOND DIY can be applied to concrete substrates with moisture contents up to 85% relative humidity tested with the In-Situ Probe method. STRONGBOND DIY can be applied to concrete substrates with pH readings up to 10.0.

SURFACE PREPARATION CONTINUED

If mechanical preparation is required, prepare the floor using recommended preparation methods such as shot blasting, diamond grinding, to provide a roughened, clean, sound, and open porous surface. Acid washing is not an approved method according to current standards.

Thoroughly vacuum loose material and dust. Test all concrete substrate flooring for moisture content, according to the current Australian Standards prior to priming or the installation of any floorcoverings. Indentations and uneven concrete subfloors should be treated with levelling compound and be in accordance with the manufacturer's recommendations.

Timber floors must be dry and free of dirt, dust, grease, oil, paint, etc. Care must be taken that floor sanders have not used solvents excessively in sweeping off. Floors must be well ventilated underneath. When adhering to highly absorbent surfaces, the use of one or more coats of clear acrylic primer is strongly recommended.

APPLICATION

Do not thin but stir if necessary.

It is recommended to apply the adhesive with an appropriate notched trowel as advised by the floor coverings manufacturer.

When laying sheet products, allow the adhesive to tack up before applying floorcovering. Atmospheric conditions will determine the tack up time, but do not allow the adhesive to skin over. The floorcoverings must be placed into wet adhesive film. Roll or smooth out to remove air bubbles and assist in wetting of vinyl. Double dropping can be adopted with this adhesive.

CLEAN UP

Water while wet. Toluol/Mineral Turps when dry.

STORAGE AND SHELF LIFE

Can be stored in the original sealed container for approximately 12 months. Store between 5° C and 25° C in a cool place. Must not freeze.

NOTES & PRECAUTIONS

Drying times can be extended when applied in cold ambient temperatures.

Do not apply on substrates subject to rising damp. For internal use only
